Dear Dr. Irene Kamberidou

Thank you for your recent participation in presentations of the European Centre for Women and Technology in Brussels the 4-7th of March. In order to move forward with the International Taskforce for Women & ICTs (ITF) in Europe we thought it appropriate to clarify our expectations and confirm your involvement.

Background

The International Taskforce on Women and ICTs (the Taskforce) was initiated in year 2005 by Claudia Morrell, Executive Director of CWIT, UMBC, underpinned by a Declaration of Agreement that the foundation with Guiding Principles serve as for the organization (http://www.umbc.edu/cwit/Declaration.html and enclosed). The Taskforce was established to promote communication and information exchange; increased sharing of research, knowledge, and resources; development of collaborative activities; policies and programming that support women's participation and leadership in all areas of ICT for development. The goal is to ensure that the participation of women in engineering, education, and employment in ICT is globally measurably and significantly increased within five years.

The ITF has managed through the Leadership Meetings organized in 2005 in Baltimore¹, in Paris in 2006² in Kuala Lumpur³ in 2007 to mobilize around 100 key multi-stakeholders from all over the world and energize high-level decision makers of the UN, UNESCO, the European Commission, the World Bank, the Inter American Development Bank, major multinational companies as HP, Texas Instruments, Cisco, Microsoft, IBM, AT & T and Dell as well as regional public key actors, companies, universities, research institutes, regional and global NGOs from all continents to support a new 'Bold Global Multi-Stakeholder Strategy and Action-plan to bring about a major break-through in regard to women's participation in the knowledge-based economy'. The Taskforce represents a broad community of expertise and has been recognized by the United Nations Global Alliance for ICT for Development (UNGAID) as such.

As a result of the Leadership Meetings and consultations carried out in Baltimore, Paris and Kuala Lumpur a broad consensus has emerged that there is a need to continue the global, inclusive, transparent, multi-stakeholder dialog focused on bringing about a major breakthrough in the field of women's participation in the knowledge-based economy.

Setting up of a global hub 'Global Women and Technology' and Ten Regional Centers based on a global framework for bringing about major changes and achieving considerable impact was seen by most participants as the optimal approach.

The meeting organized by the ITF and Paperbank Innovation, Norway on the 7th of March 2008 in Brussels was the 1st Multi-stakeholder Partnership Meeting to establish a European Centre for Women and Technology that can connect to the Global Framework of like Centres to amplify the impact of the collective intelligence around the world on behalf of women and girls in four key focus areas: education, workforce, entrepreneurship and leadership.

At the International Symposium in *Baltimore* 12-15th of June 2005 two hundred and fifty participants representing six continents and 28 developing and developed countries, including leaders from business, government, non-government agencies, and education participated.

²The UNESCO Task force Conference 'Re-Engineering Development: Engendering ICTs' held in Paris 12-15th of November 2006 agreed on formalizing the International Task Force (ITF) for Women.

³ The Leadership Meeting of the ITF in *Kuala Lumpur* 9-10th of December 2007 approved the Bold Global Multi-Stakeholder Strategy and Action-plan to bring about a major breakthrough in regard to women's participation in the knowledge-based economy and setting up of the Global hub 'Global Women and Technology and Ten Regional Centres.'

- ✓ Partner for EU and other bid-mapping analysis;
- ✓ Participate in two annual meetings per year.

Your input is very valuable, and we fully welcome all your contributions. However, please note that the working group is purely advisory and action-oriented. There will be no legal or financial implications in agreeing to serve and there is no compensation for this position.



A High-level Advisory Committee, led by Dr Rosalie Zobel, former Director of the Directorate for Components and Systems of the Commissions DG Information Society and Media will guide the strategic goals of the European Centre for Women and Technology, the delivery of its Action Plan, and its role in the International Taskforce of Women and ICTs.

Ms. Claudia Morrell, Chair of the ITF said, "For the world to address the global challenges we now all face, we must ensure our best and brightest minds are engaged in finding innovative solutions, and that includes women. I'm delighted that the Europeans have provided the needed leadership to establish the first of the ten Regional Centres that will actively work to implement concrete solutions to ensure women and men are fully engaged in the knowledge society for their own benefit, as well as the benefit of us all."



Dr. Petra Püchner Managing Director Steinbeis Europa Zentrum, Stuttgart

Steinbeis Europa Zentrum (SEZ)— that has recently celebrated its 20th anniversary— is one of the founding members of the ECWT. What would you say is the added value of a European Centre as it is now taking shape?'

We have a situation in Europe, where the different regions and countries - due to different traditions and cultures - show a mixture of and high variation in the involvement of women in technology. Germany has developed a lot of different measures - but in the statistics Germany is still lagging behind other EU countries. On the other hand, we find countries with high presentation of women with university studies in technology subjects, but when it comes to leadership in academia or industry, there is a gap. There is a need to create a full picture in all related fields of involvement for women in technology. ECWT can not only collect the various measures and outcomes, but can support the exchange and deliver mutual learning environments for policy, industry and research.



Dr. Luis FernándezMember of the Executive Board of ATI, the Spanish member of CEPIS

ATI is the Spanish member of the Council of Professional Informatics Societies (CEPIS) with around 3500 members. ATI has recently applied to become the Spanish National Point of Contact (N-POC) of ECWT. 'What motivated you to apply for this position and what work needs to be done in Spain to get more girls and women into the ICT sector?

As the main IT professionals association in Spain, we develop different lines of action referred to the analysis of IT profession. Both studies and feedback from experts confirmed that there is a clear female underrepresentation among IT professionals and particularly in students enrolled in IT university degrees. Although this situation is similar to other European and non-European countries, we do not perceive a wide and consistent effort in companies, authorities, associations or any institutions to analyze this in a more detailed way and, consequently, there is no common point of coordination for possible actions.

We sincerely think that our independent position would offer leadership and attract support of the different stakeholders involved. Moreover, direct information from our female members would also help to understand possible barriers for increasing female presence in IT professions and also in creating more attraction for women to take advantage of IT as personal and professional users.

Prague, the 14-15th of May 2009

No true modernisation of universities and research institutions can take place if the social relationships governing these remain based on and ruled by stereotypes, i.e. if

excellence is biased or if innovativeness is not promoted through «diverse thinking». Gender-bias is often the source of the more-ingrained stereotypes: tackling it in the management of universities and research institutions could provide the basis for radical change in other fields. Because the majority of gender-based stereotypes are already acquired at school, discussion on possible measures should start on the school level through the identifi cation and elimination of old-fashioned regulations, teaching methods and teaching materials.

Ten years of EU experience in analysing the situation regarding the field of women in science has demonstrated that the direct commitment of institutions is essential in attracting and keeping women, and men, in science.

The conference will offer the opportunity to highlight best practices, adopted in EU and third country institutions; to discuss these issues and identify which measures could be promoted in the future.

The conference is structured with plenary sessions in the mornings of 14 and 15 May and three parallel sessions in the afternoon of 14 May.

Parallel Session 1:

"How to attract young people into research?" looks at measures on the school level, both primary and secondary.

Parallel Sessions 2 & 3:

"How to change organisations and the working environment?" will cover the same topic but with some variations.

Proposed framework for presentations, discussions and the report

Background

The Women for Smart Growth workshop builds on the eight priority areas concerning the improvement of women's position and involvement in ICTs, the Digital Age, and the Digital Agenda, proposed at the conference Women in Science, Engineering and Technology in the Digital Age, Budapest 6-9 March 2011.

The background of this workshop is, however, much more far-reaching. It also builds on the series of conferences, events and activities promoting more full engagement of women in ICTs led by the Commission, and, specifically, by the DG Information Society over the last 5 years. Of key impact among in these endeavours have been the DG INFSO's Shadowing Day for Girls scheme and the Code of Best Practices for Women in ICTs. These initiatives won wide recognition, including from the Financial Times, which during the 2009 conference interviewed the girls who participated in the shadowing scheme that year to uncover their relationship with digital technologies and what influenced their career decisions.

The interview with the FT revealed a critical generational, geographical and skills gap that exists in society today with regard to the attitudes towards ICTs and the level of engagement with digital technologies. The principal concern with relation to the aims and aspirations of the Digital Agenda is that whilst young women (and men) have completely embraced ICT innovations as users, they have been increasingly rejecting ICTs oriented careers. This trend has important policy implications with regard to the innovation goals contained within the Digital Agenda, the EU2020 Strategy, and the hopes for new ways of promoting societal and economic development in Europe, linked to R&D, following the recent financial crisis.

The EU 2020 Strategy has multiple horizontal gender aspects, as well as multiple roles and expectations for ICT's to play: as an employment market, as an enabler of innovation, as a source of new innovation ideas, as a tool for taking ideas to markets, and as a driver for cultural change.

To make effective progress towards the Digital Agenda, Europe can draw on a number of already existing strengths, which provide important competitive advantage, for example, its highly educated and trained women (e.g. 52% university graduates); innovation and entrepreneurial cultures; experience and expertise of gender mainstreaming; and women's share of the markets for innovations and products.

Importantly, the growing participation of women in employment, which achieved a 2.1% trend growth in the Eurozone over the last decade, and its consequent impact on economy ('womenomics'), has created new champions of gender equality actions among economics researchers, in places such as Goldman Sachs, Deutsche Bank and World Economic Forum and Harvard Business School. Recent reports have recommended gender equality measures as "possibly the most important action" - better than quantitative easing and other macro policies - that policy makers could take to promote long-term sustainable growth. A study from the Harvard Business School estimated women's global annual consumer spending to be in the region of \$,20-30 trillion.

The Women for Smart Growth workshop is therefore very timely and important. It builds on the solid research evidence regarding women and gender issues in ICTs, and in science in general; the European network of women in ICT, created with the support from DG INFSO; and extensive opportunities for collaboration with industry and institutional networks.






