

Dr Serafeim Poulos is Professor in Oceanography and Physical Geography appointed (since 1998) at the Department of Geology & Geoenvironment of the National & Kapodistrian University of Athens. He has a Diploma degree in Geology from the University of Athens (1985) and a PhD degree in Oceanography from the University of Wales (1989).

His scientific and research interests are primarily in the broader field of Oceanography and, secondarily, in Physical (Environmental) Geography and, in particular, those that refer to the coastal environment. In particular, my oceanographic interests include descriptive physical oceanography, nearshore hydrodynamics, aspects of environmental oceanography (suspended sediment, pollution of water and sediment), satellite oceanography, marine sedimentology with emphasis in the field of sediment dynamics. Regarding the subject of Physical Geography, I work on land-sea-air interaction processes, coastal geomorphology (e.g. delta rivers, lagoons, beaches and dunes), coastal erosion, riverine water and sediment fluxes, sea level change, coastal meteorology (e.g. sea storms), coastal archaeology and in issues of coastal zone management.

He is **Director of the Laboratory of Physical Geography**, active member in 4 Scientific Accusations and currently President of the Hellenic Oceanographer's Association, while he has participated in more than 50 International Conferences.

He has been involved in more than **32 research and applied projects** (in 12 having the role of either coordinator and /or scientific responsible), while he was on board in 11 oceanographic cruises.

He has **supervised** more than 25 diploma dissertations, 28 MSc theses and 8 Phd theses. He is currently Director of the Master Degree: "Oceanography and Management of Marine Environment" organised by the National & Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) and the Hellenic Centre for Marine Research (HCMR).

He has **published** more than 60 papers in peer review scientific journals, 10 book chapters and more than 90 conference papers.
